There was a welcome and introduction to what the committee is, what it is NOT, and what we will be responsible for in the up-coming year. Please reference the hand-out distributed during the meeting.

CSC is a legal mandate, a must-have that helps gather input and make for a better school.

Becca made a lovely analogy—think of our CSC as the bumpers in a bowling lane. We are here for guidance and support.

We reviewed the school performance framework. In doing so, Becca will email for ideas that can be incorporated into the framework before the next meeting. The teachers have absorbed the lesson plans into their daily routines. As Mrs. Keane pointed out, these practices are living in the classroom at all times.

The Unified Improvement Plan was outlined by Principal Kline. She noted that the achievement gaps of the children are getting larger than in prior years; the student body is performing differently than in the past. There is consideration of changing some schedules to accommodate for more intervention and extra support.

In more notes to extra support, we have less behavior issues thus far in this school year, and the goal for the 2017-2018 is to decrease the behavior referrals by 25%. We also have social and emotional support for students at this time in the form of a para (part time).

The UIP is a living document, changing as does the student body daily, so we need to be aware of this component.

At this time we do not have the school budget or the school performance results to discuss. These will be addressed in following meetings per Principal Kline.
